- Head Start educators participated in several advanced PL opportunities facilitated by OVEC consultants, including cognitive coaching, partial tuition reimbursement for those pursuing certification, and access to an in-house Child Development Associate (CDA) program.
- ElevatED has partnered with Trimble Teacher Navigators to design vibrant learning experiences, performance assessments, and simple lesson design shifts to boost learner engagement, with additional support provided through ElevatED's regional design studios.
