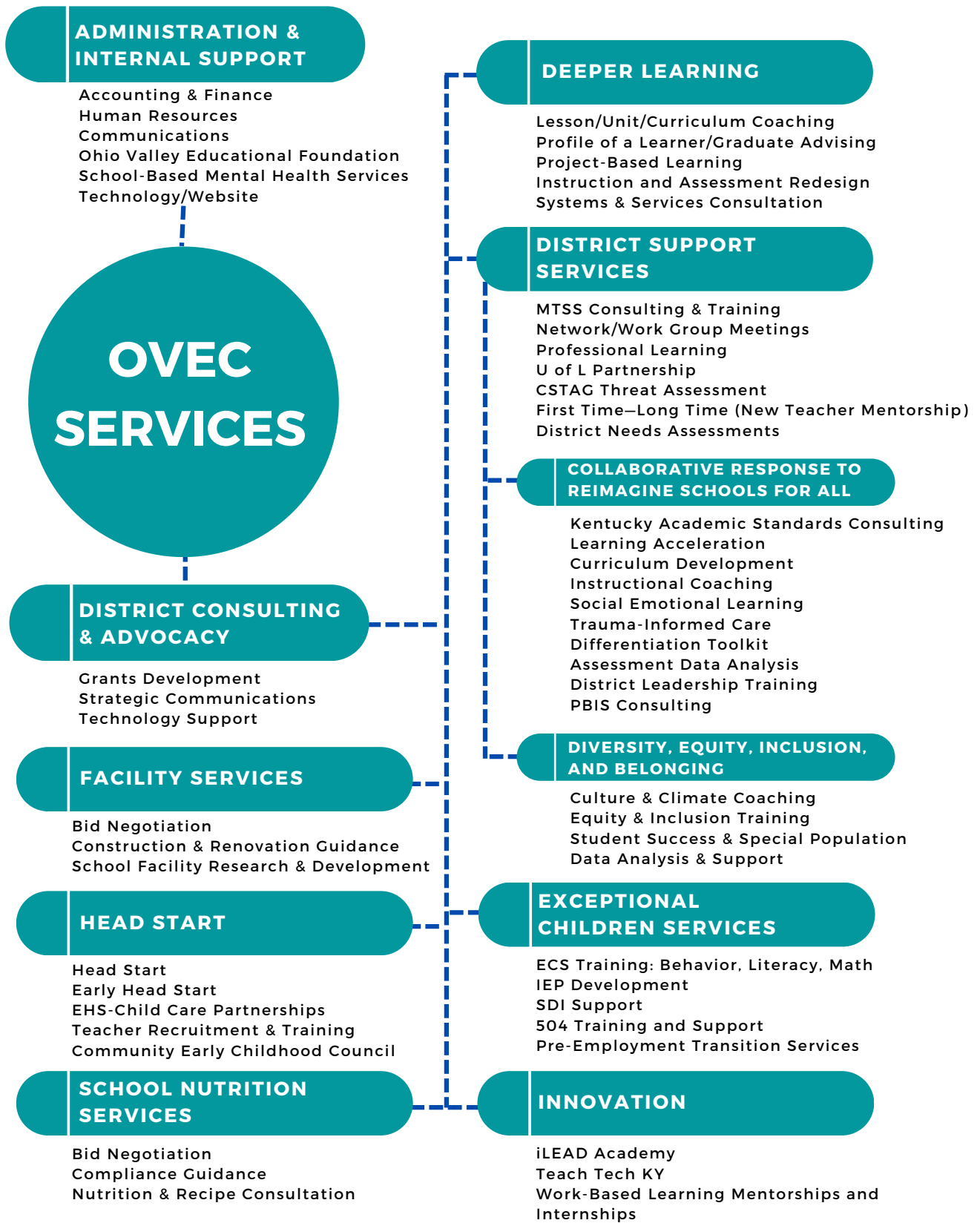

Districts benefited by receiving millions of dollars of direct program funding for early childhood, technology, and exceptional children education. Districts also saved millions in basic services and maintenance due to our team’s knowledgeable bid negotiations. And new this year, dues have been reduced, and districts have been able to apply for direct funds for certain reimbursable projects. Our commitment to transforming the student experience continues. Our goal is to be intentionally present and to make educators’ work more fulfilling and sustainable.

First Time - Long Time

One of our goals at OVEC is to make educators' work more fulfilling and sustainable. To provide mentorship to new teachers (teachers in their first 3 years or teachers seeking additional certification in a high-need area), we started a new teacher support and retention program called First Time - Long Time. The program provides monthly meetings, weekly office hours, and a summer conference to support teachers, as well as tuition reimbursement.
